Admission: \$45.00 (until April 1, 2008) and \$50.00 (after April 1, 2008)

To ensure we are in compliance with The Mariners' Museum Park policies, as well as rules and regulations of May Moon Beltane Festival (MMBF), we require that all vendors, attendees, visitors and staff adhere to all policies as described below. In so doing, we assure that we will live within the laws and coexist in peace, harmony, civility and safety. **NON-COMPLIANCE TO THESE RULES AND POLICIES CAN RESULT IN EXPULSION FROM THE FESTIVAL WITH NO REFUND.**

PARK ACTIVITIES: No swimming, fishing, boating or wading in any of the water anywhere in the park at any time.

ALCOHOL & DRUNKEN BEHAVIOR: Open consumption and/or containers of alcohol are NOT permitted! Drunken and disorderly behavior will be grounds for expulsion from the event.

DRUGS & ILLEGAL SUBSTANCES: There will be absolutely NO drugs or illegal substances at MMBF or anywhere in the park. Violators will be arrested!

CHILDREN: Be mindful that some Beltane activities can be of a mature theme. You MUST sign in each minor attending MMBF with you. **Minors must be supervised by their parent/guardian AT ALL TIMES and are not permitted at the Fire Circle after 10 pm.**

WEAPONS: No firearms or weapons are permitted in the park or at MMBF with the exception of costume or peace-bound blades. Compliance to the law is the wearer's sole responsibility.

RESPECT: All attendees are to be respectful of festival staff and staff.

LITTERING & TRASH: No littering in ANY FORM—including the dropping of cigarette butts—will be permitted. Trash receptacles and butt cans will be provided. Not only is littering illegal, but it goes against everything we believe as Tribes of the Earth.

GATE: The gate is locked at midnight and non-campers must leave by that time.

CLOTHING: Clothing IS REQUIRED and must be legal in public.

NOISE: Noise curfew is from 12 a.m. until 8 a.m. and is in place to be respectful and considerate of residents nearby, as well as MMBF attendees. MMBF staff and park security will determine any situations concerning noise and have final say.

VEHICLES: All campers and vehicles MUST be moved to designated parking lot after unloading.

SPECIAL NEEDS: If you have any particular needs or special requirements due to disabilities, please contact any MMBF staff member so we can do our best to accommodate and assist you. There will be handicapped toilet facilities.

CAMPFIRES & CAMPSITES: Campsites are to be kept clean of trash or clutter. Small personal campfires are permitted in small containers, such as portable pits and grills. All fires in campsites are your responsibilities. Museum and MMBF staff have final authority for approval of personal fires.

PETS: Pets are allowed and MUST remain on a leash at all times. Owners are totally responsible for ANY problems caused by their pet such as excessive barking, damage or injury. Owners MUST scoop all poop!

SACRED SPACE: The Fire/Drum Circle at MMBF is sacred! All drummers, dances and attendees need to read the rules of etiquette and conduct themselves accordingly.

FIRE CIRCLE: You may NOT throw trash or cigarette butts into the fire! The Fire Circle Team is solely responsible for tending to and caring for the fire. **NO UNAUTHORIZED PERSONS ARE PERMITTED TO TEND THE FIRE!**

MMBF CANCELLATION: There is no rain date and no refunds will be issued.

FACILITIES: There is no electricity and there are no showers at the park. There is a water faucet near the pavilion. Bring your own chairs as seating at the pavilion is limited.

FOOD & BEVERAGES: There will be a food vendor on site. You are permitted to bring your own coolers, food and drinks.
